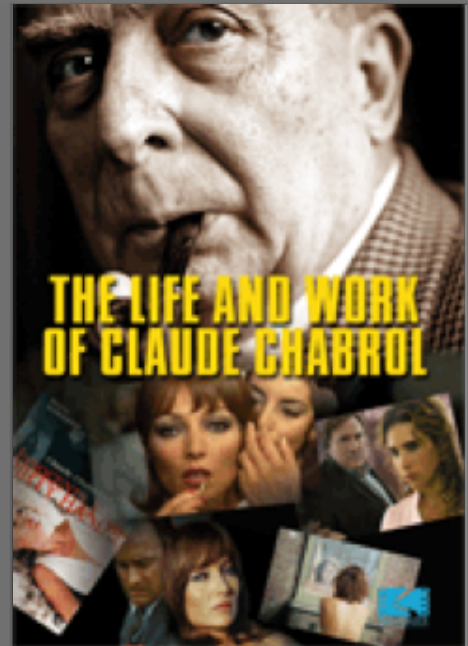
Synopsis

Claude Chabrol (June 24, 1930 - September 12, 2010. With Truffaut, Godard, Rohmer and Rivette, The French New Wave revolutionized the way we see movies today.
